“Current Status of the Green Communities Act of 2007”

December 3, 2008

Frank Gorke, Director of the Division of Energy Efficiency
Massachusetts Department of Energy Resources.

With the recent passage of the Green Communities Act of 2007, there exists a substantial amount of new and improved opportunities for those in the energy efficiency and renewable energy arena. Such areas of particular interest include State goals such as meeting 25% of its energy needs via energy efficiency, load management, demand response, and green generation. In addition to the State initiatives, many Cities and Towns will have access to monies for the installation of energy efficiency measures and Green Generation. For homes and businesses, the ability to partake in renewable energy resources has also become more attractive, and interest continues to grow in the related sectors of solar and wind generation. Tonight's presentation will update us on the major initiatives and how we, as the energy engineering community, can benefit from them.

Presenter:

Frank Gorke is the Director of the Division of Energy Efficiency at the Department of Energy Resources. He is responsible for the Commonwealth's energy efficiency policies and programs, including implementing the efficiency provisions of the Green Communities Act of 2008 and managing the Department's oversight of utility efficiency programs.

Prior to joining state government he launched Environment Massachusetts, a non-profit environmental advocacy organization, where he worked with the Save Energy Coalition to lobby for passage of the Green Communities Act. He also wrote the initial drafts of language that became the Global

- 4) A description of the facility including the location, building type, building size, primary use

(retail, office, etc.) and any unique characteristics.

These project/award descriptions may be developed and submitted by the designer, energy engineer, owner or utility involved in the projects. We would like to recognize both the owner and the implementer of the project. Award recipients are judged by the following categories A) Innovative approach to Energy Reductions (Solutions Based) B) Innovations towards comprehensiveness C) looking for projects in all out member states Vermont, New Hampshire, Maine, Massachusetts and Rhode Island.
